Officer Brittany Maxwell Began 11/06/2006 EOW 10/28/2010 @1558 (was last call on the radio for Officer Brittany Maxwell, badge number 457 and her badge number has since been retired.) She was given a full Police Honors funeral and burial.

Brittany began her career law enforcement career with The Murfreesboro Police Department on 11/06/2006 as a patrol officer. In the summer of 2010, she was assigned to the COPS unit of the Murfreesboro Police Department.

She is survived by her parents Kimberly and Joseph Maxwell, III and her brother AJ Maxwell. Mrs. Kim Maxwell said that Officer Maxwell knew at a young age that she wanted to be a police officer so that she could make a difference in the community she grew up in. Officer Maxwell was also voted one of Murfreesboro Magazine's 25 Most Beautiful People of Murfreesboro for 2010.

The Brittany Project: Police Officer Brittany Maxwell was a vibrant young officer with the Murfreesboro Police Department. Officer Maxwell was stationed at the Franklin Heights Housing Complex where she served the community as a COPS officer. Inspired by a young child who lived in the community, Brittany started The Christmas Tree Project. This project was intended to collect artificial trees for those children and families who otherwise will not have a tree. Brittany was very passionate about The Christmas Tree Project and was working on a goal of collecting at least 30 trees.

Unfortunately, Brittany passed away before this project was completed. Her family and friends have decided to complete this project in her memory.
