I hope this letter finds all doing well. I am writing for a dispatcher and her family who is need of help. Her name is Cathy Martin, and she has been an employee of the Morgan County Emergency Communications District for a little over five years now. She is a dedicated, extremely hard working, and loyal employee. Her and her family has come into some hard times over the past three to four weeks. It started with her husband getting badly burnt in a brush fire. He was in the hospital for two weeks in the burn unit, where they had to do skin grafts. On her way back from the hospital to bring the kids back home her vehicle broke down, and we are still in the process of getting it fixed. The next day her daughter was in a four-wheeling accident where her cousin had minor injuries, but has since made a full recovery. Upon her husband getting out of the hospital she had to disinfect her house due to his injuries and the threat of infection. As she was doing this she injured her back and is now having problems getting around. Just this week on Sunday morning (9-11-11) her house burnt. The fire departments were able to save a small section of the house, but they lost everything they had. I know this may seem hard to believe, but this is the chain of events that has happened to this family over the past few weeks.

This is a hard working family, who in the hard times still try their best to help others in need, and now they are the ones in need. I am calling upon our fellow brother and sister dispatchers and emergency services family to please if possible, help this family who has been through so much in such a short time.

We have started a relief fund here at our office for the family and will be taking any donations that can be given. I know I can say on behalf of the family all help would be greatly appreciated. If you can donate in any way, please send donations to the following:
